

FFY22 SNOFO

- (1) NOFO APPLICATIONS PRIORITY LIST RELEASED 9/13 (OR 9/14)
- (2) SNOFO APPLICATIONS DUE SEPTEMBER 15
 - a. Priority list released October 4
 - b. Esnaps entry completed by October 11
- (3) DRAFT TABLE OF CONTENTS FOR The Plan is available
- (4) Definitions begin on page 12 of the SNOFO
- (5) "This NOFO supports this highly vulnerable population by supporting CoCs in their efforts to identify people living in unsheltered situations, including encampments, and connect them with health and housing resources."
- (6) The Rule, 24 CFR 578.3, definitions of homelessness in paragraphs 1 (except that persons coming from transitional housing must have originally come from places not meant for human habitation, emergency shelters, safe havens, or institutions where they resided for 90 days or less and originally came from places not meant for human habitation, safe havens, or emergency shelters) or 4.
- (7) NO ACQUISITION, NEW CONSTRUCTION, OR REHABILITATION
- (8) HMIS data entry is a direct program cost (and should go in that budget line item)
- (9) This application is a duplicate of the one in esnaps.
 - a. and must describe the population(s) and subpopulation(s) they will serve, the type of housing and services that will be provided, and the budget activities that are being requested
- (10) CoCs are expected to closely review information provided in each project application to ensure:
 - a. all proposed program participants will be eligible for the program component type selected;
 - b. the information provided in the project application and proposed activities are eligible and consistent with program requirements at 24 CFR part 578,

- c. each project narrative is fully responsive to the question being asked and that it meets all the criteria for that question as required by this SNOFO;
 - d. the data provided in various parts of the project application are consistent; and,
 - e. all required attachments correspond to the list of attachments in e-snaps that must contain accurate and complete information that are dated between June 22, 2022 and October 20, 2022.
- (11) Eligible projects include:
- a. permanent supportive housing (PH-PSH) projects;
 - b. permanent housing-rapid rehousing (PH-RRH) projects;
 - c. Supportive Service Only projects; and
 - d. Joint TH and PH-RRH projects;

When can they turn in the snofo applications?

SNOFO applications can be turned in any time between now and September 15.

Do applications need to provide 25% match documentation right away?

Match documentation would need to be uploaded in eSNAPS for projects that are selected. If you're currently deciding which match to use, that's fine, but please don't turn in an application if you are not sure that you'll be able to secure a match by September 16/

Should we request the amount needed for one project year or the amount needed for the three-year grant term?

The application amount should be for 3 years of project funding to be expended over the 3 year grant term.
